

International School Award 2020-23

International School Award Achieved

Dear Parents, Carers, Governors, Friends, Staff and Pupils

The last academic year presented us with many barriers to overcome and the cancellation of many of our events scheduled for the second half of the school year, but thanks to your incredible support and involvement we have achieved our first International School Award.

It is testament to our staff team and pupils that despite the difficulties we have all faced, we can still hold on to our values and principles. We have certainly seen this year just how much international cooperation and friendship is needed for the well-being of us all.

The award measures our engagement in a minimum of seven international activities at least three of which have to involve our international partners in Germany and Poland.

Our activities included of course the hugely successful "Hands of Friendship" project which engaged

everyone and our international partner schools throughout lockdown.

This is in addition to "My Life in a Box" in which Y5 pupils share a representation of their world with children in Germany and Poland. Meanwhile, Y6 created a single representation of their town or country in "My Town and Country in a Box," having debated what actually are the most important representations to display. This is completed alongside guests from Poland.

The "International Sporting Events" are now well established parts of our annual programme as is of course the hugely significant two week International Festival which this year was of course centred on Italy.

This on its own was probably enough to meet the criteria for the ISA. Highlights included Opera

Singing with our special guest, Pizza making, La Ligua Football, Boccia, Fabulous Art Projects and of course the Festival Evening. We are hoping so much that we will be able to have a Festival in February 2021. Keep your fingers crossed for us.

I copy the comments from the British Council here and overleaf:

BRITISH COUNCIL ARE IMPRESSED!

The award is held for the next 3 years.

Here are the assessor's comments to highlight where your application was particularly impressive and points to take note of as you continue to develop the international dimension in your school:

"It is clear to see that Woodmansey CE Primary is building and embedding a real learning ethos which sits at the heart of teaching and learning at the school and is informing long-term planning and policy. This is reflected in the school's School Improvement Plan. There are well-established school partnerships taking place with Germany and Poland, all of which are being used as an effective vehicle with which to enable increased awareness of ways of life, cultures and experiences in the world.

There is lots of evidence that a whole school approach is ensured through the embedding of outcomes / an international focus across the curriculum and in the teaching and learning experience for all. This is supported by the involvement in wider initiatives such as Fairtrade Enterprise and the East Riding Transforming the Teaching of Modern Foreign Languages programme. Within this Impact Evaluation is evidence that recommendations from the Action Plan feedback have been acted upon and that an update from this is demonstrated. Good to see that you have responded to this by specifically referring to Activity 7 and the impact this has had on lunch-time staff.

Several interesting and cross curricular activities have been carried out with link schools (My Life, County, Country in a Box / Cultural Exchange) to enable a real understanding and appreciation of culture and diversity and develop concrete active citizenship and authentic language skills via direct communication and collaboration.

Impact is being felt by pupils/staff, parents and the wider community (Italy International Arts and Culture / Hands of friendship which was done at home by families during school closures) with information provided for some activities in terms of monitoring and evaluation tools used to gauge this.

This Impact Evaluation clearly outlines the commitment to sustaining the delivery of



genuine, effective and excellent learning across the school.

Congratulations on working so hard to co-ordinate such an impressive range of work as an International Co-ordinator! You are a credit to the school and the wider community.

Thank you for taking part in the International School Award. Please convey our very best wishes and many congratulations to all staff and pupils both in the UK and overseas who have taken part in the scheme."

ARRANGEMENTS FOR CONSULTATION EVENINGS OCTOBER 2020

We would really like to see you, but in the current circumstances this is going to be difficult.

Myself and the teaching team have had several discussions about how to run the consultation evenings scheduled for the week before half term.

In order to do this in a Covid Secure Manner, it will not be possible to have the usual system of parents being physically invited into school. The layout of our school building does not provide enough space to keep you all distanced and moving safely around.

Therefore telephone or video call meetings held over Microsoft Teams will be arranged. Your choice can be selected on the booking form which will be sent out to you separately. If parents of children live in different households and would like to participate in the meeting, we ask that a video call option is chosen so both parents can attend the one appointment.

Even though we cannot welcome you all into the school building, parents will however be allowed to take some books home after the meeting to look through, **on the understanding that they are returned the next day.**

Timings will be strict, so please be mindful that teachers can only discuss each child for 10 minutes as before.

Parents may, if they wish, request as before, a longer session on the form if absolutely necessary. This will be facilitated on a different day.

Please note as we cannot have a backlog, if parents are late their appointment will need to be shortened. So if you have chosen a telephone conversation appointment, please be with your phone and if you select the video call please log on a couple of minutes prior to your appointment time. You will be sent to virtually wait in a waiting room until the teacher allows you in to the meeting. However as always, should **anyone** feel they need longer, a further appointment can be facilitated at a mutually convenient time.



In October I traditionally announce the start of preparations for the annual charity fund raising appeal. The children then submit their forms to put on shows, run stalls and organise special events for the Charity Fund Raising Campaign. A chance to give thanks

Every year we hold a special Harvest Festival Assembly. This is still to occur this year, but in a different format.

On Monday 5th October - Thursday 8th October, children are invited to bring Harvest Gifts to school. Each class group will present their gifts by making a display in each classroom. This year however I invite pupils to bring long life tinned, jarred, dried or bottled food stuffs. We ask not to send fresh foodstuffs this year as we cannot hold our harvest market for charity. All the donations this year will be given to the Beverley Food Bank for distribution. In view of all the difficulties being experienced by many people in our own town, this seems an appropriate moment to use our festival of thanks to make a particular difference for people facing hardship.

On Friday 9th October the display will form the centre piece of our Friday Assembly, which will be filmed in advance for the school. Although the weekly assembly for the children will now be just an in-house event, on occasions assemblies will be again made accessible to families as they were during the lockdown with sections provided by Beverley Minster. This will also be shared with parents. It is a chance at least for me to keep in touch as parents' access to the school is to be so limited.
