PE and the Arts are given high priority, with dedicated leadership and participation in local competitions, helping us secure awards like the Gold School Games Award, International Schools Award, Eco Schools Green Flag Award.

We are committed to high-quality teaching in all subjects. Our curriculum inspires, broadens horizons, and connects children to their heritage, community, and world. It secures pupils' physical and mental well-being, and prepares them to be open-minded, engaged citizens. Mastery approaches are embedded, particularly through our Maths Mastery programme using Maths No Problem.

Beyond the classroom, we offer extensive enrichment through clubs and activities, from sport to the arts. Specialist coaches provide expert guidance, and our annual whole-school productions showcase pupils' talents to the wider community.

Curriculum Organisation

Our curriculum ensures every child receives their entitlement across subjects. Time allocations for each subject are protected to preserve depth and balance. Cross-curricular links enrich learning where meaningful. Special weeks and themed days bring the school together, including Reading Explorers Week, STEM Week, our International Festival and our Charity Fundraising Fortnight. We also celebrate key cultural, national, and religious events, ensuring pupils gain understanding of a range of world faiths alongside Christianity.

Learning and Teaching

Our teaching combines clear planning with creativity and innovation. Teachers use varied techniques and environments to engage learners, including extensive use of technology. Pupils are encouraged to take risks in a safe, supportive setting, building resilience and confidence. Mastery is central: children secure knowledge deeply so it forms a foundation for future learning.

Our inclusive approach ensures those with SEND or identified as vulnerable are fully supported to achieve their best. The learning environment and teaching styles are adapted to meet diverse individual needs.
